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NFDC

50 YEARS OF RE-DEFINING INDIAN CINEMA

With antecedents in the mission of the Film Finance Corporation to aid in the production of formally and socially courageous cinema, the National Film Development Corporation of India has been an integral part of the history of Indian cinema. With the setting up of the National Film Development Corporation Ltd, a new manifesto was set in place for the nurturing of cinematic voices that sought authenticity and truth in addition to establishing alternative spaces for filmmakers beyond formulaic and purely commercial cinema.

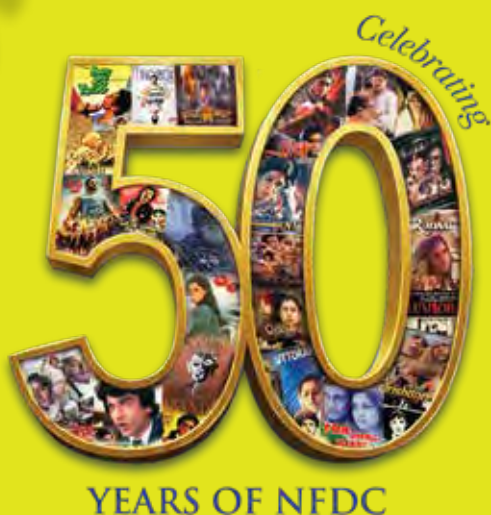
The National Film Development Corporation (NFDC), established in 1975, is the central agency under the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India, dedicated to promoting high-quality Indian cinema and nurturing a space for the integrated development of the Indian film industry. It evolved from the Film Finance Corporation India founded in 1960, with the core mission of financing and promoting films that tread beyond commercial cinema to art, parallel, and regional films reflecting India's diversity.

Over its five-decade-long journey, NFDC has produced and financed over 300 films across more than 21 Indian languages. It played a pioneering role in the New Indian Cinema or parallel cinema movement of the 1970s and 1980s, backing landmark films such as *Padatik* (1973), *27 Down* (1974), *Jaane Bhi Do Yaaro* (1983), *Salaam Bombay!* (1988), the Oscar-winning *Gandhi* (1982) and *Salim Langde Pe Mat Ro* (1989) among many others. These films garnered critical acclaim globally and opened space for socially relevant and meaningful storytelling. NFDC films have been widely showcased and awarded at prestigious film festivals including Cannes, Berlinale, Venice, Toronto, and Busan, cementing Indian cinema's stature on the world stage.

NFDC's remit extends beyond production financing. It has nurtured emerging filmmakers and encouraged creative experimentation and narrative diversity. In 2022, the corporation absorbed key film institutions such as the Directorate of Film Festivals (DFF), National Film Archives of India (NFAI), Films Division (FD), and Children's Film Society of India (CFSI), becoming the custodian of India's cinematic heritage. Through the National Film Heritage Mission, NFDC has preserved and restored classics and rare films, safeguarding cinema history for future generations.

The NFDC Distribution division plays a vital role in bringing independent and regional films to audiences across traditional theatres and new digital platforms. Its vast catalogues comprise over 150 feature films, 200 children's films, and upwards of 5,000 documentaries, animations, and shorts in more than 25 Indian languages. NFDC has forged partnerships with major domestic studios and streaming platforms including Sony Pictures Networks, Reliance Jio, Viacom18, Zee, Amazon, Tata Play, and Prasar Bharati, as well as with international distributors like Criterion Collection (USA), MUBI (UK), Channel 4 (UK), and Carlotta Films (France). This worldwide outreach helps showcase and expand the reach of India's diverse cinematic expressions.

The NFDC International Promotions team orchestrates India's participation at key global film festivals and markets, including the "Big Four" - Cannes and its Marché du Film, Berlinale and the European Film Market, Venice Biennale, and Toronto International Film Festival (TIFF). It promotes Indian cinema's stellar presence and facilitates critical dialogues between Indian filmmakers and the global film fraternity.



One of NFDC's flagship initiatives is the Waves Film Bazaar, initiated in 2007 and held annually during IFFI in Goa. Originally called Film Bazaar, it evolved into Waves Film Bazaar to represent the dynamic expansion into a multi-sector creative marketplace encompassing film, music, animation, VFX, and digital content industries. This five-day international market cultivates creative collaborations and financing partnerships, focusing on South Asian cinematic talent and content while encouraging world cinema sales within the region. Over the years, acclaimed films such as *The Lunchbox*, *Margarita with A Straw*, *Ship of Theseus*, and *Court* have benefited from the Bazaar's nurturing ecosystem.

India Cine Hub, formerly Film Facilitation Office, now under NFDC, serves as a single-window platform facilitating international film productions and co-productions with partner countries. It administers incentives for filming in India and positions the country as a competitive cinema production destination.

The Domestic Film Festivals wing, through NFDC and the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, supports the growth of film culture nationwide by financially aiding over 20 film festivals during the 2024-25 financial year, a considerable increase from just two festivals in the 2022-23 period. NFDC also organizes premier events like the International Film Festival of India and the Mumbai International Film Festival, central to India's film exhibition landscape.

The NFDC-National Film Archive of India (NFDC-NFAI), established in 1964, preserves both national and global cinematic heritage by preserving film materials and fostering film research through screenings and publications. Its vast collections include film reels, still photographs, posters, song booklets, and press clippings spanning Indian cinema's rich history. Membership in the International Federation of Film Archives (FIAP) since 1969 highlights its global stature.

The National Museum of Indian Cinema (NMIC) in Mumbai serves as a cultural treasure chest, showcasing the evolution of Indian filmmaking from the silent era to the digital age. Managed by NFDC under the Ministry's aegis, NMIC offers interactive exhibitions and rare artefacts housed in heritage Gulshan Mahal and a modern facility, inviting visitors on a cinematic journey through India's film history.

NFDC's activities extend beyond film production and preservation. Its Media Solutions Team, offering comprehensive production and communication support, serves numerous government ministries and public institutions through content creation, social media campaigns, and media outreach promoting diverse governmental initiatives.

Moreover, NFDC has gained recognition as an Awarding Body with Dual Certification by the National Council of Vocational Education and Training (NCVET) in collaboration with the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship. It now actively supports skills development in the media & entertainment sector through training, assessment, and certification programs.

NFDC's Mumbai headquarters and a cultural venue in New Delhi both act as hubs for screenings, premieres, and industry events, fostering creative dialogue and supporting cinematic excellence regionally and nationally.

As NFDC celebrates its 50th anniversary in 2025, its legacy reflects a remarkable journey of cultural enrichment and artistic innovation. It stands as both guardian and innovator, harmonizing Indian cinema's historical roots with the forward march of contemporary filmmaking. NFDC's golden jubilee is a tribute not just to institutional resilience but to its enduring commitment to India's cinematic voice, a commitment captured in its evocative tagline: "Cinemas of India".

The festival's newly rebranded WAVES Film Bazaar acts as South Asia's largest film market and is crucial for content creators and producers aiming for international collaborations and co-productions, further underscoring India's aspiration to become a global creative hub.

As the festival embraces the theme "Converging Creativity with Technology," the 56th IFFI exemplifies how innovation and imagination coexist, enriching the cinematic ecosystem and heralding a new era for storytelling where technology morphs into an essential creative ally, enabling filmmakers to transcend traditional boundaries and engage audiences worldwide.



AWARDS @ 56th IFFI

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

GOLDEN PEACOCK - BEST FEATURE FILM

The IFFI Best Film Award (officially known as the Golden Peacock for the Best Feature Film) is the main prize of the International Film Festival of India. A cash prize of Rs. 40,00,000/- is shared between the Director and Producer. The Director also gets the Golden Peacock and a Certificate, while the Producer gets a Certificate.

SILVER PEACOCK - BEST DIRECTOR

The IFFI Award for Best Director. The winner is selected from the 15 films (12 International Features and 3 Indian Features) competing in the Best Film International Competition. The Best Director in this category receives a Cash Prize of Rs. 15,00,000, the Silver Peacock and a Certificate.

SILVER PEACOCK - BEST ACTOR (MALE)

The IFFI Award for Best Actor (officially known as the Silver Peacock for the Best Actor Award (Male)) is presented to an actor for the best performance in a leading role. The winner is chosen from the 15 films competing in the Best Film International Competition. The Best Actor in this category receives a Cash Prize of Rs. 10,00,000, the Silver Peacock and a Certificate.

SILVER PEACOCK - BEST ACTOR (FEMALE)

The IFFI Award for Best Actor (officially known as the Silver Peacock for the Best Actor Award (Female)) is presented to an actor for the Best performance in a leading role. The winner is chosen from the 15 films competing in the Best Film International Competition. The Best Actor (Female) in this category receives a Cash Prize of Rs. 10,00,000, the Silver Peacock and a Certificate.

SPECIAL JURY AWARD

The IFFI Special Jury Award (officially known as the Silver Peacock – Special Jury Award) is presented to a film for excellence in any aspect of the film which the Jury wishes to recognise. The winner is selected from the pool of 15 films competing for the Best Film Award, and given to the Director of the film. The Award carries a Silver Peacock, a cash prize of Rs. 15,00,000, and a Certificate.

SILVER PEACOCK - BEST DEBUT FEATURE FILM OF A DIRECTOR

The IFFI Award for Best Debut Director (officially known as the Silver Peacock for the Best Debut Feature Film of a Director) aims to recognize and encourage the most promising new directorial talent in international cinema. The winner is shortlisted from the selection of 5 International and 2 Indian films competing for the Debut Feature Award. This Award includes a cash prize of Rs. 10,00,000, the Silver Peacock and a Certificate which is awarded to the Director.

OTHER AWARDS

ICFT-UNESCO GANDHI MEDAL

The International Film Festival of India (IFFI) 2025 in collaboration with the International Council for Film, Television and Audiovisual Communication (ICFT), Paris, presents a special ICFT prize to a film which reflects the ideals promoted by UNESCO - especially: Tolerance, Intercultural Dialogue & Culture of Peace.

The international honor, instituted at the 46th International Film Festival of India, is awarded to the Director of the film chosen from a selection of films (10) competing for the prize. The Award consists of the UNESCO Gandhi Medal and a Certificate.

SATYAJIT RAY LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CINEMA

This prestigious award, instituted in the name of legendary filmmaker Satyajit Ray, consisting of a cash prize of Rs. 10,00,000/-, certificate, shawl, Medal (Silver Peacock) and a scroll, is conferred upon a master filmmaker/film technicians/film personalities for their outstanding contribution to cinema.

INDIAN FILM PERSONALITY OF THE YEAR

The Award is presented to an Indian film personality for their outstanding contribution to Indian cinema. The Prize includes a cash prize of Rs. 10,00,000/-, a certificate, shawl, and the Silver Peacock.

BEST DEBUT DIRECTOR OF INDIAN FEATURE FILM

This year's IFFI will showcase Indian debut films, highlighting diverse narratives from emerging filmmakers. Up to five features will compete, with the Best Debut Director receiving Rs. 500,000, shared if multiple directors win.

THE BEST WEB SERIES (OTT) AWARD

Awarded to one web series for artistic merit, storytelling, technical excellence, and overall impact. The Director(s)/ Creator(s) and Producer(s)/ OTT Platform will share a cash prize of Rs. 10,00,000/- and receive individual certificates.

Previous awardees have included luminaries such as Martin Scorsese, Carlos Saura, Michael Douglas, and most recently, Phillip Noyce in IFFI 2024.

Far more than an accolade, the Satyajit Ray Award symbolizes a beacon of inspiration, urging filmmakers to pursue integrity, imagination, and social conscience, values that continue to illuminate the ever-evolving world of cinema.

Rakeysh Omprakash Mehra
Jury Chairperson

Rakeysh Omprakash Mehra is a leading figure in contemporary Indian cinema, acclaimed for his socially relevant and impactful cinema. He began his career as an ad filmmaker before directing his first feature, *Aks*. Mehra rose to prominence with *Rang De Basanti*, which won multiple National Film Awards and Filmfare Awards, and was India's official entry to the Oscars. His *Delhi-6* gained critical acclaim and biopic *Bhaag Milkha Bhaag*, based on the legendary athlete Milkha Singh, was a blockbuster and awarded for direction and script. He also directed *Mirzya*, and *Mere Pyare Prime Minister*, which addressed social issues faced by children.



Graeme Clifford
Jury Member

Graeme Clifford is an acclaimed Australian filmmaker who began his career as a film editor for over a decade before transitioning to directing. His editorial work includes iconic films like *The Rocky Horror Picture Show*, *Don't Look Now*, and *The Man Who Fell to Earth*. Clifford made his directorial debut with the biopic *Frances*, depicting actress Frances Farmer's tragic life, which earned critical praise and Oscar nominations for Jessica Lange and Kim Stanley. His follow-up was *Burke & Wills*, a historical drama about Australian explorers, noted for its intense storytelling and beautiful cinematography. Clifford then directed *Gleaming the Cube*, a skateboarding action film starring Christian Slater and *Deception*. Later, Clifford shifted focus primarily to television, directing acclaimed TV movies and miniseries like *The Last Don* and episodes of series such as *Twin Peaks*.





Remi Adefarasin
Jury Member

Remi Adefarasin is celebrated British cinematographer known for his masterful visual storytelling. He began his career at BBC's Ealing Studios, starting from trainee to cameraman over nearly two decades. Adefarasin gained international acclaim for his work on *Elizabeth*, for which he received an Oscar nomination and won the BAFTA Award for Best Cinematography. His diverse filmography includes *Truly, Madly, Deeply*, *Sliding Doors*, *Onegin*, and *Woody Allen's Match Point*. He also shot *Elizabeth: The Golden Age*, the sequel to *Elizabeth*, winning critical praise for capturing the period's grandeur. Adefarasin's work in television includes notable TV series like *Band of Brothers* and *The Pacific*. With a career marked by elegant camera work and an eye for detail, Adefarasin was honoured with an OBE for services to television and film.



Katharina Schüttler

Katharina Schüttler is a renowned German film and television actor celebrated for her versatile and fearless performances. Trained at the Hanover University of Music, Drama and Media, she began acting for film and television at the age of eleven and quickly distinguished herself across stage and screen. Internationally, Schüttler is acclaimed for her leading roles in the miniseries *Generation War* which won an International Emmy and Channel 4's *The Promise*, cementing her reputation as a compelling artist. Her film credits include *Sophiiiie!*, *Free Fall*, and *Oh Boy*. Beyond film, Schüttler is one of Germany's leading theatre actors, lauded for her performances in classics such as *Lolita*, *Hedda Gabler*, and *Joan of Arc*. She won the Bavarian Film Award, German Television Award, and the Ulrich Wildgruber Prize. Married to director Till Franzen with two children, Schüttler continues to inspire as a driving force in contemporary European cinema and theatre.



Chandran Rutnam

Chandran Rutnam is a pioneering Sri Lankan filmmaker, producer, and entrepreneur known for his remarkable contributions to the international film industry for over four decades. Rutnam's early exposure to cinema began when his family home was used as a location for *The Bridge on the River Kwai*, inspiring him to pursue film from a young age. He studied filmmaking at the University of Southern California and gained recognition for attracting Hollywood productions to Sri Lanka, working closely with directors including Steven Spielberg, David Lean, and George Lucas. Rutnam's film credits range from production management on *Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom* to directing award-winning local films like *The Road from Elephant Pass* and *A Common Man*, the latter starring Ben Kingsley and earning accolades at the Madrid International Film Festival. Beyond cinema, Rutnam founded the Asian Film Location Services and Lion air aviation company.

Gemma Blasco studied Directing and Screenwriting at the Bande à Part film school in Barcelona. She also trained in Acting workshops and Filming in Barcelona with Abbas Kiarostami. As the tides of sea mirror her inner turmoil, moments of kindness and cruelty define her path towards self-reliance. The film is a sensitive exploration of motherhood and endurance portraying a women's quiet defiance against despair as she clings to love, dignity, and the promise of renewal in an unforgiving social landscape.

The Evolution of India's Premier Film Bazaar

Originally conceived as a platform to foster South Asian content and talent in filmmaking, production, and distribution, the IFFI Film Bazaar, initiated by the National Film Development Corporation in 2007, has grown into South Asia's premier global film market. Held annually alongside the International Film Festival of India in Goa, it has evolved into a vibrant hub attracting international filmmakers, producers, sales agents, and festival programmers for creative and financial collaborations.

Over nearly two decades, the Film Bazaar has showcased and supported numerous acclaimed Indian films such as *The Lunchbox*, *Margarita With A Straw*, *Titli*, *Court*, and *Anhe Ghode Da Daan*, bolstering their journey toward international recognition. NFDC's support has been instrumental, having backed over 300 films across 21 regional languages, many of which have earned national and international acclaim.

The 2024 edition of the Film Bazaar marked a significant milestone, with 1,876 delegates from 42 countries, reflecting a 142% increase in attendance from the previous year. Business projections exceeded 500 crore, underscoring its growing commercial impact. This edition also introduced modern industry elements, including a Tech Pavilion featuring 15 technology partners, further expanding opportunities for innovation and networking.

In a strategic rebranding move, the Film Bazaar was relaunched as Waves Film Bazaar to position India as a vibrant global hub for the media and entertainment ecosystem. This reimagining broadens the scope beyond films to include music, animation, VFX, and radio, enabling multi-sector collaborations. Waves Film Bazaar's offerings include market screenings, work-in-progress labs, producers' workshops, and country pavilions, all emphasizing holistic industry growth.

The evolution from Film Bazaar to Waves Film Bazaar reflects a visionary expansion from a South Asian film market to a comprehensive global entertainment marketplace, reinforcing India's stature as a leading creative and commercial nexus in the international audiovisual landscape.

WAVES Film Bazaar and the International Film Festival of India (IFFI), in collaboration with LTIMindtree, are launching the first-ever CinemAI Hackathon as part of the 56th edition of IFFI. It celebrates the convergence of art, technology, and ethics in filmmaking. This initiative invites creators from around the world to explore the limitless potential of Artificial Intelligence in storytelling. The CinemAI Hackathon is a two-stage creative technology challenge open to all, with no entry fees. The winning entries will be awarded significant cash prizes.

The 'Experimental Films' section at the 56th IFFI, stands a finely curated tribute to cinema's most audacious and imaginative voices. This segment presents a compelling array of works that transcend conventional narrative structures and cinematic norms, articulating themselves through singularly original and idiosyncratic idioms that challenge and broaden our conception of what cinema can encompass. Through daring formal experiments and originally creative storytelling techniques, these works push the boundaries of cinematic art, offering audiences new sensory and intellectual experiences. Embodying an ethos of fearless artistic inquiry, this section beacons viewers into dialogue with visionary creators who reimagining the very grammar of visual art.



Contact Lens imagines women's emancipation from confined spaces and monotonous routines. The film transforms imagery into a fluid feminine essence, revealing a woman's complex, multifaceted nature in a timeless, boundless space. 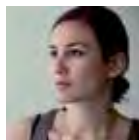

From dreams that flicker in the minds of youth to frames that capture the nation's soul, the Creative Minds of Tomorrow (CMOT) initiative at the 56th International Film Festival of India unfolds as a refreshing celebration of emerging cinematic artistry. This edition will a vibrant mosaic where aspiration meets opportunity, weaving together 100 talented young creators across 13 diverse crafts to illuminate the future of Indian cinema on the global stage.

Since its inception during the 52nd IFFI in 2021, CMOT has rapidly evolved into India's foremost platform to recognize and nurture aspiring filmmakers and technicians. The initiative has attracted 225 alumni from across India's vast geographic and cultural spectrum, including representatives from Northeastern states and Jammu & Kashmir. This growth is reflected in the rising number of participants—from 75 talents across 10 crafts in earlier editions to a robust 100 youths mastering 13 different filmmaking disciplines this year, including animation, sound recording, and virtual reality. Notably, CMOT saw over 799 applications in 2025 alone signalling its impactful acceptance and prestige within India's creative community.

Beyond numbers, CMOT's success stories resonate globally. Alumni have contributed to international blockbusters such as "Dune" and "Meg 2," while garnering accolades at Cannes, Berlinale, Toronto, and the International Emmy Awards. This inspiring legacy, coupled with strategic partnerships like Netflix's "Voice box" initiative supporting women voice-over artists, confirms CMOT's role as a pioneer in empowering diverse cinematic voices and fostering marketable creativity.

Integral to CMOT's impact is the 48-hour filmmaking challenge, encouraging teamwork and creativity under pressure, which exemplifies the real-world industry's demands. Through mentorship by distinguished CMOT champions and collaborations with prestigious institutions like SRFTI and FTII, the initiative not only fosters talent but also propels India's ambitions as a global creative economy. For CMOT Selection, there is a three-tier jury, consisting of a jury, grand jury and great grand jury. There are 13 distinguished members in the selection jury from various areas of filmmaking. Another jury with 12 highly decorated filmmakers constitutes the Grand jury who does the final shortlisting and an 18-member Great Grand jury, will judge the best films and awards produced by the teams at CMOT. CMOT is more than an initiative; it is a nurturing cradle of stories waiting to be told, shaping the narrative of India's cinematic tomorrow with boldness and innovation, firmly establishing IFFI as the gateway for the visionary filmmakers of the future.

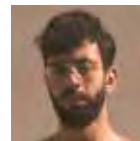

MACABRE DREAMS



Set in a fictional France haunted by a mysterious epidemic, Julia Ducournau's "Alpha" follows a troubled thirteen-year-old girl living with her single mother, a hospital doctor. Alpha shows signs of the atypical behaviour a teenager goes through, rage, defiance, and everything in between. 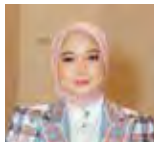

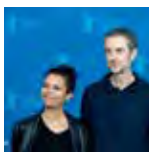

The Restored Classics section at the 56th International Film Festival of India presents four timeless masterworks from the USA, Taiwan, Japan and Australia, films that have shaped generations of cinephiles and continue to inspire new ones. Carefully restored and digitally revived, these cinematic treasures return to the screen in their full glory, bridging the distance between the past and the present. Each film has left an indelible mark on world cinema, with honours that include the Best Director Award at Cannes Film Festival 2000, the Palme d'Or at Cannes 1994, and the Special Jury Prize at Cannes 1965, along with Golden Globe nominations and Oscar entries. Kalamita follows Honza, a university graduate who joins the railway, exposing widespread conformity and inefficiency. A train journey gone awry during a snowstorm highlights these themes further. Production, plagued by censorship, flu, and harsh weather, saw filming pause. Despite minimal promotion, its critique of society led to high audience interest and a Prague screening ban.

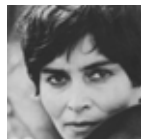

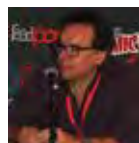

To aid communication, IFFI has deployed sign language interpreters at major events, panel discussions, and masterclasses, enabling participants with hearing challenges to fully engage in the discourse. Dedicated assistance desks staffed with trained volunteers provide support and guidance to persons with special needs throughout the festival grounds.

Beyond infrastructure, IFFI has partnered with organizations specializing in disability advocacy to raise awareness and promote accessibility within the film industry. Workshops and sensitization programs for filmmakers and industry professionals emphasize the importance of inclusive storytelling and representation of persons with disabilities.

The festival also champions the screening and celebration of films that explore disability narratives, broadening societal perspectives and encouraging empathy through cinema. These initiatives collectively reflect IFFI's evolving vision of a cinema culture that is welcoming, empowering, and barrier-free.

By prioritizing accessibility, the 56th IFFI Goa sets a benchmark in inclusivity, making cinema and its communal joy a universal experience irrespective of physical or sensory challenges.

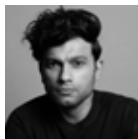
Chambal

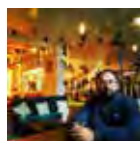

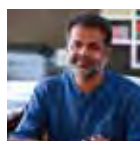

It is a poignant tale of unfulfilled love, silent endurance, and the power of memory and art.
